40TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE OMCC

During the fifth Inter American Encounter celebrated in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic in June of 1980, the International Groups existing at the time, made the decision to create the World Body of the Cursillos in Christianity (OMCC). to coordinate the Movement world-wide. It was created as a service structure at the international level, Plans for this 40th Anniversary celebration in 2020 are underway and will include a book, with inclusions written by past World Presidents and others who have contributed much to the International Movement.

CURSILLO AFRICA

OMCC has taken on the responsibility of spreading the Cursillo Movement in Africa and sees its mission as being to strengthen the Movement in all those African countries where we are present and to continue with the expansion programme of Cursillos in other countries. Cursillo is already active in the following African



countries thanks to the generosity of Cursillista brothers and sisters who have given of their time and resources over the years: South Africa, Uganda, Lesotho, Ghana, Benin, Togo, Burkina Faso, Mozambique, Angola and Equatorial Guinea. With God's favour many other countries in the continent will soon be reached.

In order to assist the outreach of Cursillo to Africa, the OMCC Executive Committee is promoting a campaign to commence on the Feast of St Paul at the end of January 2020. It will be called the **Three Dollar Campaign**. National Secretariats are

requested to invite a 3 dollar gift, or its equivalent in local currency, from each Cursillista. One dollar will go towards the Africa Project, one dollar for the OMCC and one dollar for the International Group.

WEBSITE



A MESSAGE FROM Fr JOHN

With the approach of Advent, we often start to notice the pace quicken as we come closer to Christmas. Media encourages us to start focusing on what is in the future in anticipating of what is unfolding and what we prepare for. There is a sense of expectation that this will all turn out as we plan and be an experience that we will not easily forget. Yet this very anticipation may well rob of us the peace of becoming present to the presence of Jesus who accompanies us along the journey.

This is the remarkable mystery of this season. That in the midst of well-planned lives everything is turned upside down in a way which draws a person into a way of being present which they had not expected. This is often seen as a threat to our well-ordered lives, but it is the place where our anticipation meets the vision of God after which nothing can be the same. We start to discover an incarnate way of living where God enters into our human story with great intimacy and vulnerability. This puzzles and amazes us with wonder in how we are called to respond. This is not how we expect God to become present to us but it does teach us something important about our life and prayer.

God meets us as we are not as we think we should be and allows us to notice how in offering our whole self to this unfolding mystery nothing will ever be the same. As you prepare for Christmas may the peace of Christ disturb you.
