Insurance

Thanks to the hard work of our Treasurer, Joe Jambor, we now have a policy with QBE Insurance to cover Cursillo activities for the year, commencing 29/4/2024. This policy covers public liability but does not cover abuse issues or other criminal activity. It was impossible to find an insurance company which does so. Safeguarding

Information received from the Safeguarding office of the Brisbane Archdiocese is that because the Australian Cursillo Movement has been recognised by the ACBC, each diocese must contact their Safeguarding office to ascertain what information needs to be on their Diocesan website to comply with Safeguarding regulations. Currently, treasurer Joe is waiting for information about the wording that needs to go on the National Website.

Website

It would be good if we could have some regular communication between Webmaster Pablo Rossi, and the cursillistas in the Dioceses who are responsible for putting local information on the site. This would enable us to make maximum use of the website.

National By Laws

Since it was decided to change the role of Coordinator to Secretary in the wording of our By Laws, we decided to look at the whole document to see if anything else needed changing. A draft of these changes has been sent to Diocesan delegates for discussion and the final draft will be voted on at the next National Secretariat Meeting. Another document has been prepared as a commentary to accompany the By Laws, which provides a more detailed explanation of what the roles and responsibilities of Executive members entail. It is important to be clear about what the positions involve.
