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A recent conference on evangelization in Southeast Asia, hosted by the Office of Evangelization of the Vietnam Bishops' Conference, gathered a diverse group of 45 participants from eight countries, including the Philippines, Malaysia, Myanmar, Singapore, Thailand, India and Vietnam, and a Franciscan Brother form the US. The event, held at the Bishop's House of Xuan Loc Diocese, included bishops, priests, religious sisters and brothers, and parishioners, with engaging sessions and discussions over five days.



Participants united in prayer, shared, and delved into topics about Synodality with the Universal Church and the challenges and opportunities in Proclamation the Good News in Asia. This was all in commemoration of the 25th Anniversary of the Apostolic Exhortation of the Church in Asia (Eccelisa in Asia) of Saint Pope John Paul II and the 50 years of the Apostolic Exhortation Evangelii Nuntiandi of Saint Pope Paul VI. In addition, 2033 will commemorate the 500th anniversary of the Catholic Church in Vietnam. Five hundred years full of persecution and martyrdom, and yet, a celebration of faith as people had a chance to receive the Christian Faith in this S-shape land. Because of the profound significance of these upcoming events, the Department of Evangelization under the Vietnam Bishops' Conference hosted this pivotal conference.

It must be honestly said that the Apostolic Exhortation of Saint Pope John Paul II sent to the Church in Asia has passed its 25th year. However, it seemed that the Apostolic Exhortation has still been very foreign to the mainstream people in Asia in general and Catholics in this vast continent in particular. That was why this Conference invited all participants to renew the spirit of the Apostolic Exhortation, or in other words, reviving the Teaching of the Holy Father, who earnestly invited the shepherds and evangelizers who proclaim the Good News must always be present and accompany their laity to proclaim Jesus Christ as Savior and His mission of love and service in Asia, as well as in response to the invitation to participate in the mission of proclaiming the Good News, which the document in Bangkok in 2023 was given by the bishops as a guideline for practice: "Journeying together as peoples of Asia."

The challenges of proclaiming the Good News in Southeast Asia

Participants attending this congress recognized that the challenges raised in Pope John Paull II's Apostolic Exhortation "The Church in Asia" 25 years ago were still current and topical and had become even more complicated by new realities and circumstance.

Jesus was born in Asia, but paradoxically, most of the people in this vast continent still don't know Him and still see Him as a character from the West, a person foreign rather than Asian (EA, 20). Choosing to incarnate as an Asian, yet His message has not been fully integrated and accepted into the cultures of this continent and its diversity. Cultural integration and efforts to find a language and expression to convey the closeness of the God-Man Jesus to the peoples of Asia were nearly impossible. The difficulties in proclaiming Jesus as the only Savior were compounded by secularism, relativism, urbanization and globalization, and ideologies and cultural barriers.

The original message of God's love in Jesus is often forgotten in the digital age and social media. Internet addiction is sometimes even more robust than its use. Illegal drugs make people today.



especially young people, confused about what is real and what is virtual. In a hyper-connected world, people find themselves lost and isolated.

Asia is also a continent with religious pluralism, multiculturalism, and different ideologies, including atheism. They also need salvation. It's been a long time since the Catholics would like to confront other forces and ideologies that often oppose them. However, evangelizers who proclaim the Good News in the 21st century need to reset their missionary strategies in searching and dialoguing with people of different beliefs, religions, non-believers, same opinion, other cultures, and even dialogue with non-believers of communism. Those are some of the comments of a bishop who presented the challenges of spreading the Good News in the coming years.

Opportunities for spreading the Good News in Southeast Aisa

The challenges we face in proclaiming the Good News mentioned above can be transformed into opportunities and open doors to discover new paths in the proclamation of the Gospel in Asia, especially in Southeast Asia.

The witness of those who proclaim the Good News needs to be encouraged and wholeheartedly promoted. The testimony of married couples and groups of married people in announcing the Good News in local communities is the first sign of hope that should not be extinguished. Enthusiastic, Spirit-filled parishioners and trained evangelizers sent on missions always need the companionship of pastors to have the missionary fire because the mission cannot lose its zeal and dynamism.

The testimony of bishops, priests, and religious always accompanies their collaborators in a humble, joyful spirit, ready to share their dreams and experiences with other participants. It will make everyone feel the love of Jesus, the Good Shepherd, the One who will never abandon His flock.

A sharing by the bishop in charge of the Proclaiming the Good News Committee about

the formation and development of the Church in Vietnam since the seed of the Good News was planted up to the present time. The many ups and downs, oppression, persecution, and even sacrifice of one's life to maintain one's faith are living testimonies of the proclamation of the Good News.

In other words, the methods of the local churches on how to reach out and be close to people with different beliefs and religions, as well as those who have been baptized but are now indifferent towards the life of faith. The exchange of gifts, stories, and the best methods of the local churches have rejuvenated the missionary activities of the conference participants. The Conference plans to fully use available missionary tools in proclaiming the Good News. Comments and sharing from lay participants in the conference also contributed significantly to the success of spreading the Good News, following the process of synodality proposed by the 16th World Synod of Bishops. The participation of lay people with missionary enthusiasm always brings promising results for bountiful harvests.

Thanks to the Conference of Evangelization to "Renew the spirit according to the Apostolic Exhortation of the Church in Asia." Thank you for the sincerity, simplicity, and complete pastoral love from the Vietnamese bishops and bishops from other FABC member countries. We are the church and want to do something for the church, not just stop at reports or events with winged words. The challenges and opportunities that this conference presents, as well as the ways new developments in proclaiming the Good News in Asia in general and Southeast Asia in particular, will take shape our church soon. May the Holy Spirit ignite a fire of passion in our souls so we can live and renew the spirit of the Apostolic Exhortation of the Church in Asia. We hope that by walking together as the peoples of Asia, always knowing intentionally fraternal and communion, the synodal missionary Church may gradually become a reality, and we will be constantly urged to "Go and make all nations followers!" O Mary, Mother of the new creation and Mother of Asia pray for us, your children. Now and forever.

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KOREAN PILGRIMAGE TO NAGASAKI, JAPAN, MAY 2024

To learn and feel connected to the history of Christianity in Japan. The Korean Pilgrims journey to Nagasaki.

The journey began in Kyushu, Japan with a visit to the beautiful Urakami Cathedral, the birthplace of the Japanese Catholic Church. This cathedral holds significance as it was the site of an atomic bomb attack in 1945, where many believers were killed. The cathedral now stands as a place of prayer for peace. The pilgrimage also included a visit to the home of Professor Nagai Takashi, a radiologist who dedicated his life to treating patients exposed to radiation from atomic bombs. The water spewing into the Peace Park and Fountain for patients with skin damage was a poignant reminder of the devastation caused by war.

The pilgrimage in Kyushu continued with a visit to the Twenty-Six Martyrs Monument, dedicated to 24 Christians who were persecuted in 1597. The bronze statues on the granite wall depict their martyrdom. A Mass was held in their memory, and a handwritten quote from Paul Mickey reflected their strong faith and forgiveness towards their persecutors. The next day, the group visited Shimabara Cathedral, built to commemorate the 30,000 residents who were executed in 1613 for their Catholic faith. The cathedral's stained glass windows depict the harsh reality of persecution, including scenes of torture and martyrdom.

The pilgrimage continued with a walk along the Minami Shimabara Olle Trail, which offered beautiful views of the sea, forests, and paddy banks. The challenging trail led to the Kuchinotsu port, where the group applauded and welcomed the first arrivals. The following day, the group visited the martyrdom site on Mount Unzen, where martyrs were executed by being dropped into hot sulfurous water. The Unzen Cathedral was built in their honor, and the stained glass windows hold significant meanings.

I would like to thank our spiritual advisor Rev. Peter Oh for planning and leading the pilgrimage of grace giving us health in mind and body. Also I praise our Lord and thank President Francis Choi, VP Helena Yoon and everyone who devoted themselves. May we rejoice with honor to our Lord!!!
