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#### Witness July 2025

#### Read Matthew 20:25-28

As we have heard in Matthew's gospel, Jesus came not to be served, but to serve. I don't think there would be too many people in the world, that would fit into the mold of Jesus, not expecting at some point for themselves, to be served. But that is the example Jesus gave to us.

So how do I fit into that mold of service. I know for myself and possibly for you too, there is a fine line between being selfish and self-giving in regard to serving others. It is something I don't always think about, I do things for others because I love them not because I want to serve them, I guess the two go hand in hand.

That is what being a part of a family is about. I do things around the home from helping prepare food and cooking, some cleaning, washing and the list goes on. I make Adam his lunch for school when I make mine for work. It is probably spoiling him but sometimes it is easier to do both together. It is the act of service and love which keeps the home organized and harmonious as well.

Then there is the extended family. I set up a weekly zoom and send out the link for those meetings to my siblings and an aunt and uncle too. I don't know if someone else would do this if I didn't, it doesn't take long to do and it was the way we stayed in touch with each other during covid and we continued to meet this way together as well as getting together.

And Cursillo is part of my serving others as well. Especially this year in my role as one of the coordinators for our Cursillo weekend. There is a lot of time spent preparing for team meetings, making sure that everything is covered in preparing the team to the best of my ability. This is not a role I took on in the hope of what I might receive in the end. It was to bring our team together, to love them and each other, to prepare them in what they needed to ensure our candidates had the best experience of living in a Christian community which was welcoming and loving in all we did. Our act of serving.

One thing I have learnt over the last couple of years, especially through Cursillo, is not to be a servant of time. In my role as president, leading meetings it is very easy to be a time watcher. While I know it is important not to allow meetings to run forever, no one wants that, being present to people and what they may need to say is of far more importance. This is where I hear the wisdom of people and the voice of God.

One thing I have done this year, is read the reflection from Fr John sent out in our weekly update from Bernard. I try to read it each day during morning tea at work and reflect on what message may be for me, and how I can improve myself through it. This week has been on Martha and Mary being caught up in the preparations for the arrival of Jesus into their home. We all know what that is like, preparing for guests to arrive, and what happens after that.

It is important that in all the serving that is done as the host, that it does not take away from the time spent with people or the activity.

We all like to be served as well. We recently had a holiday to K, gari, Fraser Island, with my brother Rob, Mel, Alex and Johanna, and their friends Melinda, Dan and Sam. It was a very relaxing holiday, even the week before,

packing was stress free and easy, as we didn't need to organize food, Melinda had that all under control. Melinda and Dan have been to K, gari many times and had routines of preparation to go away. Melinda did a lot of cooking before we went, which meant it was only reheating food and a little bit of cooking to be done. Joanne and I sat back like royalty being waited on, no not really, we served ourselves dinner and helped the children clean up after each meal.

It was a wonderful time away. The other blessing, not that we knew it at the time, we had very little phone coverage. Occasionally I would get a message through and by the time I could answer it, no service. We didn't even watch tv, except for the disappointment of Origin. It was a real disconnect from the outside world.

We had to spend time together, with our family and with those with us. Connecting with nature, the beauty of driving along the beach watching whales cruising along or frolicking from time to time, seeing dingo's roaming, and the beauty of creation. It was nice not being servant to the internet and social media for most of that time away. We did have an afternoon on the western side of the island for that, watching the sunset while scrolling though Facebook or messenger, also checking and replying to emails. Eventually Joanne and I sat down with a glass of wine, and watched the world go by without any distractions.

Often, I forget what I need, and God shows me. After spending so much time this year on my computer, with emails, preparing Rollos and other Cursillo business, I have had time away from the computer and time to be. From the three days off work sick, after the Cursillo, to the holiday that felt like two weeks instead of one. I know that life will be busy again soon, now I feel that my cup has been filled again, I have been served so that I am ready to serve again.

We got to know each other really well.




We had a fantastic time.

I remember reading an article in last year's Sharing Magazine by Mike Norris, "When God Calls You to Be on Team." His words resonated deeply, as I felt a strong spiritual nudge to put my hand up to be a Coordinator—despite my relatively short time within the Cursillo Movement.

I joined Cursillo in 2022, after 3 years of living in Newcastle and during a stage in my life where I was searching to live a fully Christian life with other joy filled authentic Christians... From my very first encounter with other Cursillistas, I knew God had placed me exactly where I was meant to be. I am certain it was the work of the Holy Spirit drawing me into this journey.

In 2024, I had the privilege of serving on team under the leadership of Mike and Linda Norris.
